Chalk Talk Topics

Mu Topic - Math in Walt Disney World Alpha Topic - Math in Universal Orlando Theta Topic - Math in the Movies

Chalk Talk is a 7-minute presentation about the topic relevant to the mathematics topics for the division. Theta talks should have Geometry and Algebra 2 topics, Alpha talks should have PreCalculus topics, and Mu talks should have Calculus topics.

The first round of Chalk Talks is done by the students at home or school and recorded and downloaded to YouTube so the judges can easily watch them. The top 10 talks in each division move on to the final round on Monday, July 7 in Orlando. Finally, we also want to thank YOU for all you do and if you ever have any questions, please feel free to call the office. We are here to help!!





Chapter Grants

Chapter grants of up to \$1,000 over the lifetime of the chapter are available to help chapters provide interesting mathematical experiences for their members, others at their school, and their local community that further the mission of Mu Alpha Theta. No chapter will be granted more than \$1,000 over time, but a chapter may apply more than once if they have not reached their \$1,000 limit. Grants are competitive and



not all grant requests may be funded. There is no deadline for this application. Grant funds can be used to pay invoices or reimburse receipts after the event.

Hello Mu Alpha Theta members,

I am Sukeerth Goly, the current president of the Rickards High School Mu Alpha Team and the Mu Alpha Theta Student Delegate President.

This year, the Rickards Invitational will occur on **Saturday, November 9th, 2024**. The Rickards Invitational is the largest entirely



student-run math competition in the Southeastern United States, with around a thousand participants from more than 40 schools around the nation competing in past years.

The event will run from approximately **8:00 AM to 4:00 PM**, with competition rounds from 9:00 AM to 12:10 PM. Lunch and snacks will be available for purchase when registering for the on-site version of the competition.

The competition consists of an individual test, a team test, and a secondary individual test for those not competing on the team test (an open test). Students will compete in one of the following divisions: Elementary, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus, Statistics, or Calculus. Additionally, there will be mini events for up to five participating members from any school and any sponsors who would like to compete. This year, the mini events will include Speed Math and Mental Math.

This year we are continuing the **mail-in** option available to schools nationwide. The primary testing location will be in-person at Rickards High School in Tallahassee, Florida.

Below, we have indicated the format of each event.

Individual Test: The individual test will consist of 30 multiple-choice questions, in which 4 points are awarded for each correct answer, 1 point is subtracted for each incorrect answer, and blank responses are awarded no points, for a maximum score of 120 points. For the Elementary division, 5 points are awarded for each correct answer, 0 points are awarded for each incorrect answer, and 1 point is awarded for each blank answer. Competitors will have 60 minutes to work on this test.

Middle and High Team Test: Teams of at most four people will participate in the team test. A school can have at most 1 team per division. The test will consist of 12 questions with short open-response answers, with 4 minutes to work on each question. 16, 12, 8, and 4 points will be awarded for a correct response in the first, second, third, or fourth minute, respectively, for a maximum score of 192 points.

Open Test: Students not competing in the team test will take an open test. It is of the same format as the individual test. Pre-Algebra and Algebra 1 students will take the same open test, called the Euclidean Open. Geometry and Algebra 2 students will take the Theta Open. Precalculus and Calculus students will take the Mu-Alpha Open.

Mini Events: Speed Math will consist of 20 short-answer questions, and competitors will have 15 minutes to work on the test. Mental Math will consist of 40 short-answer questions, and competitors will have 8 minutes to work on the test. For Mental Math, competitors must work in a blue or black pen. Any stray marks on this test will lead to disqualification. For both tests, 1 point will be awarded for correct questions, and 0 points will be awarded for blank or incorrect answers.

Awards will be awarded to the top 15 competitors in each individual and open test, the top 5 teams in each division, the top 3 middle schools, and the top 5 high schools. Similarly, certificates will be awarded to the top mail-in

competitors.

To register to compete at Rickards High School, simply visit our website, https://rickards invitational.github.io/, and fill out the online form under the Online Registration tab. Registration for all students will be \$10 before the late registration deadline. The deadline for mail-in competitors is \$10 until Monday, November 4th and the deadline for in-person competitors is \$10 until Friday, November 1st. Late registration for in-person competitors will be \$15 per student and will be available until Monday, November 4th. For mail-in competitors, registration ends on Monday, November 4th. There is no "late registration" opportunity after this deadline. The website will also have additional information about the competition, including the competition handbook and past tests.
